Hollywood-based artist Daniel Dugan is a man of one-liners—but jokester he is not. While his eager creative counterparts might carry out their crafts as a once-you-start-you-can't-stop fixation. Dugan employs that idea as a technique. He draws one continuous line that never intersects itself to form shapes, objects, and abstracts. "It's turned into a bit of a game to not be able to find the starting and stopping point," Dugan says of the maze-like method that he developed while doodling as a 10-year-old in his native Alabama. Now his one-line artwork forms everything from words to birds to states (he's making his way through all 50 of them). He's started to bend one piece of wire to execute his skill in a new medium.
