

USE OF WALKER RODS FOR  
PRINT DISPLAY

1. Photographic display rods and curtains, owned by SEPPA, may be made available to member states for use at their annual state conventions provided scheduling allows sufficient time for return of rods so they will be on hand for all SEPPA photographic competitions.
2. Equipment will be maintained by SEPPA Exhibition Chairman or Executive Director at the direction of the Executive Committee. Presently, the rods are stored and shipped by the Executive Director.
3. Written requests for use of the rods will be made to the Executive Director, who will manage their traffic and advise state print chairmen if SEPPA can provide the rods. NOTE: Due to potential conflicting convention dates, it is advisable to make requests as soon as possible - at least six months before date of the competition. Requests will be honored on a "first come" basis.
4. Rods and allied fixtures will be shipped collect freight to state chairman, who will be responsible for safekeeping and return rods immediately following their use. NOTE: Because of weight and bulk, most chairmen will find it more convenient to ship directly from convention site and should make arrangements with freight carriers.
5. Rods may be returned to SEPPA freight collect. This cost, plus service fee will be billed to state. Billings must be kept current.
6. Service charge will be \$75 for the rods and \$75 for the curtains (plus shipping). A minimum of 100 rods will be shipped since this is the way they are stored. One hundred rods will display up to 300 photographs. The maximum available is 200 rods at this time.
7. Two Minispots are also available for rent at \$10 for the pair. The renter will need to furnish the lamps.
8. State print chairman will be advised that service fee is based upon immediate return in good order of all equipment. Shortages will be replaced at current prices and billed to the state. Above fee is for one week following close of convention. Additional time will be charged at \$25.00 per week.
